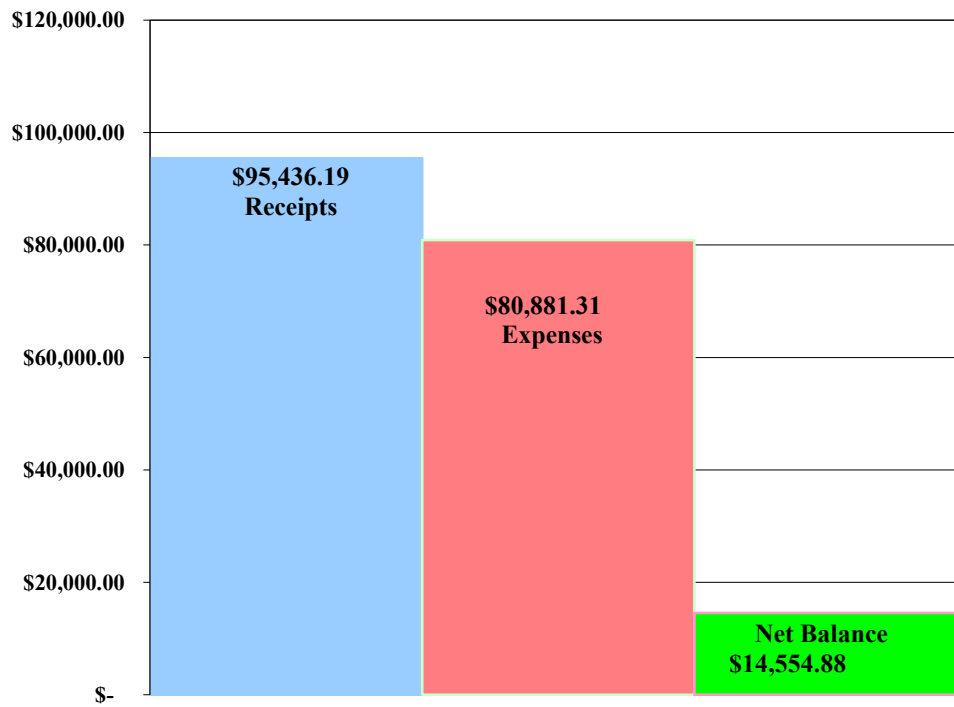

We are doing this as the baptismal bowl is very heavy and we don't want it to get damaged or broken when carrying it.
5. During the summer months, there are no acolytes scheduled, so the Ministry Board (whoever is on staff that Sunday) should be lighting the candles before the service. If they don't, we should then light them and extinguish them after the service.
