WHERE ARE YOU GOING?

"Thomas said to him, "Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" John 14:5

I recently was on a trip... a vacation! Stephanie and I went down to see her sister in Florida. We flew there, but once we arrived, we had a car to take us around. Now, neither of us had ever been there before. We've been married over 40 years and, if there is one thing that Steph has learned about me, it's that I have an excellent sense of direction. Add this to my uncanny map reading skills, I pretty much know where we are at, at any time.

I'd ask my passengers, "Where are we going?" They would tell me, and we'd be on our way. When you are on vacation in an unfamiliar area you get asked "Where are you going?" A LOT! It is as if they don't trust my innate sense of direction as much as I do.

I imagine that this is a larger, more spiritual question too. I remember my "Youth for Christ" friends back in high school. They would ask me, "Dave, do you know where you are going? Is it up or is it down?" They had the directions, right in the little pamphlet that they handed out. They knew with great certainty where they were going.

Do you suppose that is the question Jesus' disciple, Thomas, had on his mind when he asked Jesus, "**Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?**"

Like Thomas, we want certainty. We want answers. We want to trust in the direction we are headed and in the one who will take us there.

I do know where we are going. We are headed to the CROSS, to Good Friday, to Jesus' trial, his torture, his crucifixion and death.

I do know the way. It is the way of LENT. It is the way to forgiveness and unconditional love for us. There is no "alternate route" and "no shortcut." There is only one way and it is the only way. It leads us to one place and that is the foot of the cross and to our salvation.

Jesus answers Thomas with great certainty, he says, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

I know that it might be hard to believe, but I get confused sometimes. I go the wrong way. I get turned around and lost. My map-reading skills and my sense of direction fail me. It is fortunate for me (and for you, too) that Jesus does not fail ... ever! I will get to where I am going not because of my abilities but because of Jesus, who gave his life for me that I might have life eternal with him. **Come and Worship!**

P.S. By the way, I'm fully aware that no one uses real paper maps anymore. Yes, I am aware that God created GPS for people like me. I appreciate the help. God bless Google!

Artistic Ministry by Paul Oman

On May 3, 2015, Pastor and Artist Paul Oman painted the picture of Jesus receiving the little children that is currently hanging in our commons. The evening was so enjoyable and the painting so beautiful that we have invited Paul back to paint another picture. He will be joining our morning worship on Palm Sunday, April 14. When finished, the painting will be displayed in the fellowship hall. You won't want to miss this incredible opportunity, so mark your calendar and invite your friends and neighbors.

Drawn to the Word is the artistic ministry and mission of Paul Oman, pastor and professional artist. Paul creates larger-than-life-sized murals of any Bible story or theme in less than an hour as audiences are engaged by watching the process. The Biblical story comes to life before your eyes, impacting lives and congregations in profound ways.

Paul Oman was born in the United States in the beautiful state of Wisconsin, where he currently resides with his wife and children. He had a strong interest in art early on in his life, inspired by the landscapes and nature surrounding him on the farm where he spent his childhood years.



At age 10, he began receiving personal instruction in acrylic, oil, and watercolor painting. During this same year, Paul was the Wisconsin elementary youth selected to present an original watercolor to the governor at the State Capitol for Youth Art Month, a significant milestone in his life. His passion for painting and drawing continued to grow. He studied drawing in college (along with science education, and later, divinity at seminary).

Receiving national and international recognition for his work in watercolor, painting world-wide as a live-audience mural and performance artist, as well as demonstrating, teaching, speaking, and consulting, Paul shares his joy of painting and its power to communicate with people of all ages.



(Jesus said) "Go into the city to a certain man and tell him, 'The Teacher says: My appointed time is near. I am going to celebrate the Passover with my disciples at your house.'"
Matthew 26:17 - 30

The Last Supper is one of the most poignant and beautiful moments of Jesus ministry. On the last night of his time on earth, Jesus gathered His disciples to celebrate the Passover. Many Christians are familiar with the story of the Passover, but lack a deeper understanding of how Jesus himself can be found through the celebration of Passover and, even more, how Jesus is the ultimate fulfillment of the Passover.

Invite your family and friends and join us on April 3rd at 6:30 p.m. for a "Messiah in the Passover" presentation. This is a powerful visual message not only of Israel's freedom from slavery in Egypt, but of the redemption of individuals from the bondage of sin through the atoning work of Jesus. Together we will learn the rich history and symbolism of this traditional experience, all in the light of Jesus' coming as a Passover lamb.

"Messiah in the Passover" is a Chosen People Ministries program and is being presented by Trevor Rubenstein. Chosen People Ministries was founded in Brooklyn, New York in 1894 by Rabbi Leopold Cohn, a Hungarian Jewish immigrant with a zeal to share the knowledge of Yeshua (Jesus) the Messiah with God's chosen people. Today, Chosen People Ministries serves in eighteen countries across the globe. Their outreach programs include evangelism and discipleship, Messianic Centers and congregations, equipping the local church for Jewish evangelism, digital evangelism, and benevolence work.

Trevor Rubenstein, our presenter, has spent many years traveling the country, teaching at churches, and sharing the message of a saving faith in the Messiah with anyone who will listen. Trevor was also the director of the oldest evangelical outreach to the Jewish people in America. Currently, Trevor is still active in evangelism and discipleship, leading evangelism groups in Minneapolis. He is also embarking on receiving his M.Div. in Messianic Jewish Studies from The Talbot School of Theology through the Charles L. Feinberg Center.

What is the Passover

The Passover (in Hebrew, Pesach) commemorates the exodus of the Jews from slavery in Egypt. The holiday originated in the Torah, where the word pesach refers to the ancient Passover sacrifice (known as the Paschal Lamb); it is also said to refer to the idea that God "passed over" (pasach) the houses of the Jews during the 10th plague on the Egyptians, the slaying of the first born. The holiday is ultimately a celebration of freedom, and the story of the exodus from Egypt is a powerful metaphor that is appreciated not only by Jews, but by people of other faiths as well.

March Bible Quiz Question: How many times do the phrases, "Fear Not" or "Do Not Fear," show up in the Bible?

Ok, so this is a bit of a trick question. If, like me, you have attended church for awhile, you may have heard that the phrase "fear not" is in the Bible 365 times, one for each day of the year. Actually there is not a version of the Bibles that says "fear not" 365 times. For instance, the King James version says "Fear not" or "Be not afraid" 103 times, not 365 times.

So why do people say there are 365 "Fear nots" in the Bible?

Various versions of "Fear Not" are spoken of over 500 times in the Bible. Besides "Fear Not," we are told to "Fear God," which really means reverence God alone and do not fear anyone or anything else. There are also many verses that encourage us not to worry or be anxious (which is generalized fear.) In fact, "Fear not!" is the most repeated command in the Bible.

There are so many kinds of fear that we or our loved ones can face that saying "Fear Not" is easier said than done. We all long for more of God's peace in the midst of the stresses of our lives!

Did you know that you can choose not to be afraid? 2 Corinthians 10:5 says "...and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ." When we are afraid, we take that fear captive and make it obedient to Christ. How do we make it obedient to Christ? Start by looking up the promises of God. The Psalms are a great place to start.


The Psalmist often leads us in a "Fear not" prayer. The Psalms are the Bible's great soul book, meant to train us to respond to all of life's situations and difficulties through prayer and trust in the Lord.

One example is Psalm 56. David has been seized by the Philistines and he starts to become afraid, but instead he sets his vision on his Lord and Savior in his midst. He praises God and His word to him: "Fear not!" He puts his trust in the Lord...

When I am afraid,
I will trust in you.
In God, whose word I praise,
In God I trust; I will not be afraid.
What can mortal man do to me? (Psalm 56:3-4)

Thank God because we need to be reminded to "Fear not" and trust God every day. We may not always get the answer to the threat or trouble we are facing but we serve a God bigger than our threat or trouble and we know He will be there to guide us through it.

What fear is trying to take ahold of you right now? What threat or trouble are you facing? Watch and pray with David, "When I am afraid of _____, I will trust in you, O Lord."

15 Ways to Teach Kids About Money the Dave Ramsey Way

Pre-Schoolers and Kindergartners

1. Use a clear jar to save - The piggy bank is a great idea, but it doesn't give kids a visual. When you use a clear jar, they see the money growing. Yesterday, they had a dollar bill and five dimes. Today, they have a dollar bill, five dimes, *and* a quarter! Talk through this with them and make a big deal about it growing!

2. Set an example - A study by the University of Cambridge found that money habits in children are formed by the time they're 7 years old. Little eyes are watching you. If you're slapping down plastic every time you go out to dinner or the grocery store, they'll eventually notice. Or if you and your spouse are arguing about money, they'll notice that too. Set a healthy example for them and they'll be much more likely to follow it when they get older.

3. Show them that stuff costs money - You've got to do more than just say, "That pack of toy cars costs \$5." Help them grab some money out of their jar, take it to the store, and physically hand the money to the cashier. This simple action will have more impact than a five-minute lecture.

Elementary & Middle Schoolers

4. Show opportunity cost - That's just another way of saying, "If you buy this video game, then you won't have the money to buy that pair of shoes." At this age, your kids should be able to weigh decisions and understand the possible outcomes.

5. Give commissions, not allowances - Don't just give your kids money for breathing. Pay them commissions based on chores they do around the house like taking out the trash, cleaning their room, or mowing the grass. This concept helps kids understand that money is *earned*—it's not just given to them.

6. Avoid impulse buys - This age group really knows how to capitalize on the impulse buy—especially when it uses someone else's money. Instead of giving in, let your child use their hard-earned commission to pay for it. Also encourage them to wait at least

a day before purchasing anything over \$15. It will likely still be there tomorrow, and they'll be able to make that money decision with a level head the next day.

7. Stress the importance of giving - Once they start making a little money, be sure you teach them about giving. They can pick a church, charity or even someone they know who needs a little help. Eventually, they'll see how giving doesn't just affect the people they give to, but the giver as well.

Teenagers


8. Teach them contentment - Contentment starts in the heart. Let your teen know that their Subaru (although not the newest car on the block) is still running well enough to get them from point A to point B. And you can still throw a memorable, milestone birthday party without spending a chunk of your retirement savings funding it!

9. Give them the responsibility of a bank account - By the time your kid's a teenager, you should be able to set them up with a simple bank account if you've been doing some of the above along the way. This takes money management to the next level, and will (hopefully) prepare them for managing a much heavier account when they get older.

10. Get them saving for college - There's no time like the present to have your teen start saving for college. Do they plan on working a summer job? Take a portion of that (or more) and put it in a college savings account. Your teen will feel like they have skin in the game as they contribute toward their education.

11. Teach them to steer clear of student loans - Before your teen ever applies to college, sit down and have the "*how are we going to pay for college*" talk. Let your teen know that student loans aren't an option to fund their education. Talk through all the alternatives, like going to community college or an in-state university, working part-time while in school, and applying for scholarships.

While you're at it, get "*The Graduate*



Survival Guide" for them. It's a must-have resource to help your college-bound teen prepare for the next big step in their life.

12. Teach them the danger of credit cards - As soon as your kid turns 18, they'll get hounded by credit card offers—especially once they're in college. If you haven't taught them why debt is a bad idea, they'll become yet another credit card victim. Remember, it's up to you to determine the right time you'll teach them these principles.

13. Get them on a simple budget - Since your teen is glued to their mobile device anyway, get them active on our simple budgeting app, "EveryDollar." Now is the time to get your teen in the habit of budgeting their income—no matter how small it is. They should learn the importance of making a plan for their money while they're still under your roof.

14. Introduce them to the magic of compound interest - The earlier your teen can get started investing, the better. Compound interest is a magical thing! Introduce your teen to it at an early age, and they'll get a head start on preparing for their future.

15. Help them figure out how to make money - When you think about it, teenagers have plenty of free time—fall break, summer break, winter break, spring break. If your teen wants some money (and what teen doesn't?), then help them find a job. Better yet, help them become an entrepreneur! These days, it's easier than ever for your teen to start up their own business and turn a profit.

Change Your Family Tree

Teaching your children about money at any stage is going to take time on your part. It won't always be easy. But if you want your children to know how to successfully manage their money when they get older, taking the time now will be worth it.


Yay for Pineapple


