# Proposed Amendment to the Congregational Bylaws

Submitted by: Ministry Board

At the December 2018 Ministry Board meeting, the board voted to recommend to the congregation that the Congregational Bylaws be updated. Due to the continued growth of the congregation at Lutheran Church Peace the Ministry Board is recommending the members of the board be increased to seven from the current This will allow for better distribution of tasks for committee support. This amendment will be voted on at the annual meeting on January 27, 2019 and ratified at the January 26, 2020 annual meeting. The proposed amendment will read as follows:

B3.03 The voting membership of the Ministry Board shall consist of the six seven elected members of the Ministry Board.

### Christian Education Ministry Team Report

Our Christian Education program has truly experienced an exciting time over the last year with some major growth going within the classes. We currently have five breakout classrooms and 43 children who are Sunday School aged, from preschool-5th grade (this is almost double from 22 in 2017). Our middle and high school kids also meet and range in

size for attendance, but middle school (Meghan Weaver's class) is seeing an average of 6-8 kids on any given Sunday in the conference room. Our high school group is a tight group, around 4 on any Sunday. Our Sunday

School curriculum for prek-5th has continued with SOLA which is a very user-friendly program that the teachers

have an easy time with in terms of teaching and prep. Current teachers are Kelsie Simon with the PreK, Shawn Perez with K-2nd, Nicole Johnsrud with 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade. The older kids are meeting

and discussing current topics with Meghan Weaver (Middle School kids) and Joseph Perez and Ben Simon (High School). This year our Prek-5<sup>th</sup> grade Sunday School kids start with music and

then grab a snack and head to their classes.

The noisy offering buckets came back to Sunday mornings during service, giving children the opportunity to drop their coins into the buckets at JAM time.

Also, the second Sunday of each month is our "Noisy Offering" Sunday, where the kids will go around the church with paint

cans to collect loose change from the congregation - it definitely gets "noisy." The Noisy Offering donations for January through May were used

to help provide safe water for a community in Tanzania. The total raised was \$2,790.58 (this included the Easter Breakfast donations). The September-through-December Noisy Offering donations raised \$560 and was used to purchase additional items needed to pack boxes for Operation Christmas Child. Starting in January 2019, we will be raising money for a church in Cuba that Jon Peterson visited earlier this fall.

Not only is the second Sunday "Noisy Offering" Sunday but it is also the day where the Children's Choir sing for the congregation during special music.

We continued our fourth year of SPARK in the fall and currently have approximately 15 kids that attend this after-school program fairly regularly. This is slightly smaller number than the last couple of years, but with limited helpers this is not looked at as a bad thing. On SPARK Wednesdays, the kids ride the bus to the church from the elementary and middle schools. They start with some free time to do homework, color, word finds, and enjoy a

snack. They then have an opportunity to watch a Bible story, play games and do a craft. Helpers this year are Nicole Johnsrud, Joseph Perez and Rylee May.

Our confirmation program continues to

grow with our youth. We currently have 12 students in the confirmation program (two 9<sup>th</sup> graders, six 8<sup>th</sup> graders, and four 7<sup>th</sup> graders). This year we will have four students being confirmed. Our

confirmation students meet at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesdays. They have continued with the same curriculum for the last two years. The three-year confirmation study includes; New Testament, Old Testament, and then combination/review.

Catechism and Lutheran teachings are included all three years. Teachers this year include; Ben Simon, Colette Thorson and Pastor Hanson.

The Peace Lutheran VBS theme for 2018 was "Game On." This was a very good week with upbeat music, games and a definite uptick in the number of kids that attended. We went from 53 in 2017 to 61 kids in attendance for 2018. The day consisted of Bible study, song, craft, snack and games. Next

year's theme is a safari theme called, "In the Wild" and it's sure to be another hit with the kids of Peace as well as the community. The growth is very positive and fun to experience but it does lead to

another set of space issues, so we may at some point be having a conversation about a cut off number due to space as well as helpers needed for such a large group.

Our Adult education continues with studies that come up at different times; our latest

studies consisted of a Women's group during the Summer with a study by Angie Smith called "Seamless" which studied the Bible in a chronological order. Our more recent study is one that the men have been holding from Tony Dungy called "Dare to be Uncommon." We are always looking for new ideas and for others to lead these lessons so don't be shy; this is a great time to gather many from the church and get connected.

Christian Education is always looking for and open to new members. We have a small committee that needs help creating and preparing for the growing church needs and their members' desires for ongoing educational opportunities. If you have a heart and passion for this, please join us.

The financial review by an outside accounting firm at the end of last year showed everything was in order. During the year, everything has followed generally accepted accounting principles.

I would like to thank Sue Beulke, financial secretary, and Judy Jacobson, financial administrator, for all their work. These are unpaid positions and both of them donate many hours during the course of the year

For the year 2019, we are proposing a deficit budget of approximately \$10,000. The proposed budget is needed to support the ongoing ministries as well as to extend some of our ministries.

In addition to monetary gifting decisions, the Missions team organized several opportunities for PLC members to volunteer and serve those in need. Some of the organizations supported were local, while others were national and/or

international (see table below for Mission specifics). The more notable activities for the year were as follows:

On January 27, we

held our second Missions Work Day at PLC. On this day, sewing machines, sergers and nine workers gifting 50 hours of service sewed 19 gaiters for our winter blessing bags and eight pillowcase dresses for Orphan Grain Train (OGT). We also assembled and tied one full-size

quilt for a graduating PLC senior and 14 layette quilts for OGT.

We arranged for Byron Hayunga (Carol) to present information on the Gideons to PLC during our April 22 worship service. A free-will offering was taken at the door.

Sue Ziermann spearheaded the service project for the Women of the Word (WOW) convention held at PLC on

September 15. Product from garage sales, donations and our own diaper divas was amassed, and 113 layettes were assembled by WOW attendees. These layettes were then donated to OGT.

On September 30, we hosted PLC's fourth Mission Sunday.

Instead of a guest speaker, we had team members highlight the OGT organization and its loving efforts. Notable is the low overhead incurred by OGT in its operation: over 97 cents of every donated dollar goes directly to those in need. The Mission team, along with the PLC youth, served up Peace Café. The Café proceeds were donated to the PLC youth.

> Thursday and Good Friday, culminating in 2 on


services Easter morning. This year, in August, we were able to plan and hold a special outdoor Sunday service

#### 2018 Proposed Budget

2018 Proposed Budget was presented by Judy Jacobson. The 2018 estimated income is \$232,594. It is noted that the 2018 Finance Budget is up \$25,000 from last year. This reflects a Note pay-off of \$25,000. The idea is that every year Peace will pay-off \$25,000 in Notes per year ensuring that all Notes are paid off within five years. The 2018 Budget & Income Comparison results do show a \$23,996 deficit, which takes into consideration the additional \$25,000 in the Finance Budget for the Note pay-off.
