

COME TO THE TABLE

"Hear the voice of love that's calling. There's a chair that waits for you."
Zach Williams song – To the Table

The 2019 Lenten Worship Series is called "Come to the Table." Our Lenten banner has, at its center, a round table covered by wheat and grapes representing the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper. Surrounding the table are brightly colored chairs of every shape.



Together we are invited to share the Lord's supper, to pull up a chair and join others in this holy meal. Jesus is the host and provides all we need for life.

The biblical imagery we will look at each Wednesday will focus around the powerful symbols of invitation, table, and meal. Throughout the Gospels, Jesus comes to the table for a meal. He provides the food, he eats with the rich, the poor, the young and old, the righteous and the sinners.

When Jesus is at the table all are invited to come and share together. There is a chair for everyone.

This is familiar imagery to us too. Every day we gather at tables. In school with our friends we gather for lunch, at work we call a meeting in the conference room to do business, at home we announce, "SUPPER IS READY!" and we pull our chairs out and gather as family.

There is a contemporary Christian song I've recently heard whose words are just perfect to describe this idea. The song is called "To the Table" by Zach Williams. Here is the Youtube link <https://youtu.be/2YTUE2XNyLE> I hope you enjoy his music but, as important, his words. See you on Wednesdays!





Noisy Offering

Cuba is a communist island country located between the Caribbean Sea and the North Atlantic Ocean, 329 miles south of Key West, Florida. This small island (slightly smaller than Pennsylvania) has a population of 11,116,396 people.



Under Castro's rule, Cuba became an atheist state where Christians were persecuted and marginalized. Nonetheless, the Church maintained significant influence through the educational system until its dismantling in 1961. Castro dissolved the Catholic school, seized Church properties and exiled priests and nuns. Children were then required to attend state school.

In 1992 the Cuban Constitution was amended to declare it a secular state. So while it is officially atheist and works to promote its philosophy among the citizens, it no longer outlaws other religions. As the Communist Party lessens its control over the churches, there continues to be increasing growth in religious activities.

While Roman Catholic is the dominant belief system (59%), over

the years, many Cubans have mixed various pagan beliefs with Christianity. So there is a great need for accurate biblical teaching.

Jon Peterson went on a mission trip last summer to Cuba with Oni. Oni's parents met in the US - dad came to the US in about 1962 and mom in about 1967. Even though his dad left Cuba, he still had a deep love for the country of his birth. Once Cuba was open again, Oni's dad talked him into visiting Cuba. Oni fell in love with the country and the people too and has since gone to Cuba many times to work with college students. He has been told by the government that he is not allowed to return but he continues to go back so that he can share the love of Jesus with the people.

While in Cuba, Jon met and helped many Christian workers. One person Jon met was Pastor Elmer David Entenza Madrigal. As an outreach to the people of his community of San Andrés, Pastor Elmer attached a cart to a small motorcycle and uses the cart to help get people around (such as going to church, hospital or visiting family). Very few people in Cuba have a vehicle of any kind. They have to walk, ride a bus, or use a horse and

wagon. This motorcycle is the transportation for the entire village.

Jon believes the motorcycle is a Russian motorcycle from 1943. As you can imagine, with an older motorcycle, the biggest expense is the maintenance and gas. The children of Peace have decided to take this on as their Noisy Offering mission for January - May. So far we have collected \$304.89. Our goal is to collect \$750 to be used for gas (about \$40 a month) and maintenance.

Minnesota FoodShare began in 1982 with a campaign to restock food shelves in the Twin Cities area. The effort was so successful and the need was so evident, the March Campaign became a statewide program one year later.

This campaign is the largest grassroots food and fund drive in the state. It brings together various community organizations, businesses, and faith communities to help stock nearly 300 food shelves statewide. In 2018, over \$8.1 million dollars and 5.5 million pounds of food were raised.

Minnesota FoodShare envisions a Minnesota where all residents have access to healthy food and no one struggles with food insecurity. The March Campaign

addresses these issues directly, and we invite you to join our efforts and advocate for long-term solutions to food insecurity and poverty in our communities.

The Importance of Regular Bible Reading

Martin Luther thought reading the Bible was so important that he translated it so anyone could have the opportunity to read and study the Bible for themselves. There are great benefits to our spiritual life when we read and study the Bible regularly. Here are just a few.

God's Word leads us to salvation. We are all saved by believing the truth of Scripture whether we read it ourselves or are taught it by someone else (*John 3:16; Rom. 10:9; 1 Peter 1:23*).

The Scriptures guide our steps. Psalm 119:105 says, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." If we read and heed God's Word, it will reveal where to go and what to say, help us make decisions, and warn us when we're heading in the wrong direction.

God's Word directs us to wisdom. "The unfolding of Your words gives light; it gives understanding to the simple" (*Ps. 119:130*). Scripture is like a shield before us, guarding our way and warning of danger. But if we neglect reading and obeying the Word, we won't be able to distinguish right from wrong.

It lifts our burden. Because the Lord is interested in every aspect of our lives, we can run to His Word in our pain, grief, loneliness, or sickness and receive help in our time of trouble (*Ps. 119:28*).


The Word of God brings joy. If we love the Word, we'll find great joy and comfort in reading it (*Ps. 119:111*). And if we don't have a Bible with us, He can bring to mind the verses that we've stored in our hearts.

The Scriptures give peace. "Those who love Your law have great peace, and nothing causes them to stumble" (*Ps. 119:165*). Peace means to be bound to something, and when that something is the Word of God, we are bound to Him and experience the peace Jesus promised to His disciples (*John 14:27*).

Because reading the Bible is so important, each month the newsletter will include a "Through the Bible in a Year" monthly reading plan. This reading plan is in pseudo-chronological order. A chronological reading of the Bible weaves the books together in date order to help give the reader a better overall understanding of when the events in the Bible happen.

However, the one downside of the chronological plan is that we don't get to the New Testament until fall. A pseudo-chronological order allows us to read the old and new testaments side-by-side throughout the year. In this 5-day plan, the Old Testament is arranged chronologically, and there is a New Testament reading every day. The gospels are not in chronological order, but spaced throughout the year, one for each season. And, they are done in such a way that you begin with Mark (the first gospel written), and then read some of the early epistles of Paul. Then around April, you'll be in Luke and read it alongside Acts (same author). This reading gives you the benefit of the chronological ordering for the OT alongside an engaging plan for the New Testament.

I hope you decide to join me in reading through the Bible in a year.

Story Behind "Come to the Table"

We will be starting a new Lenten series this month called "Come to the Table." As part of the worship series, we will be singing Sidewalk Prophets' "Come to the Table" released in 2015. Following is their story behind the song. The next time you sing or hear this song, remember - no matter what we've done or who we are - we are all welcome at God's table.



"'Come to the Table' was the very first song we wrote for this project. We had flown out to the lake house and we had our friend Ben Glover come in and we were sitting down and thinking and just trying to get that perfect step, that perfect start.

"And this was the song that came to our hearts and I love it, I love that line, "motley crew of misfits." We had a little discussion when that line came up and Ben Glover came up with that he said, 'I like this dude'. And to me, this is the honest truth.

"When we recorded this album we actually had a movie that went along with every single song on the album. And the movie for this song was "Hook." And when Ben Glover said that line, "motley crew of misfits..." I instantly thought of that scene where Peter Pan and Rufio and everybody is throwing food at each other. And it just reminded me of the people that God calls... we are the lost boys, we are the lost children of God, and we need to come back home. And so that 'Come to the Table' is for everybody...it's for those that are uncouth, it's for the thieves, the liars, the doubters, the sinners. This song just kinda brings it all together.

"So if you hear this song and you see Rufio throwing mashed potatoes at people, that's cool, but I hope honestly that this song goes even deeper than that, to the heart of whoever is out there that feels lost...you're welcome at the table of Christ. And the verse that goes along with that is Mark 2:16-17, this the perfect summation that God came not for the righteous, but for the sinners...



Praying with Your Children

Perhaps you've never prayed with your children. But no matter how old they are, it's never too late to start. It helps to remember that prayer is simply a conversation with God.

Here are a few ideas to get you started:

- 1) **Newspaper Prayer:** Try this idea at the beginning of the day as you're eating breakfast. Have each family member take a portion of the newspaper and circle items that he or she feels need to be prayed for. Then ask family members to pray for the things they circled in the paper.
- 2) **Sentence Prayer:** You can help your children pray aloud by giving them a sentence to complete, such as:
 - "Lord, I thank you for ..."
 - "Lord, forgive me for ..."
 - "Lord, help my friend ..."
 - "Lord, help me be more ..."
 - "Lord, help me to let go of ..."
 - "Lord, give me the courage to ..."
 - "Lord, one of the fears I need help with is ..."
- 3) **Highs and Lows:** Ask your children what their "highs" were from the day, and then ask them about their "lows" from the day. Share your highs and lows as well, and then pray for them together.
- 4) **Prayer Journal:** Share your prayer requests with the other members of your family and then record them in a prayer journal. One person can pray for all the requests you've listed for the day. The next time you pray together, look over the requests you listed previously and update any changes and answers. This is a good way to see how God has been active in your prayer lives.
- 5) **A.C.T.S. Prayer:** This is a well-known form of prayer that is easy to remember:
 - A stands for "adoration." Begin the prayer by simply adoring God for who He is.
 - C stands for "confession." Spend some time confessing your sins.
 - T stands for "thanksgiving." Take time to thank God for the blessings that He has given to you and your family.
 - S stands for "supplication." Lift up specific areas of your life in which you need God to supply for your needs.




