We have enjoyed our time here and watching God's growth plan for Peace. This year, we have quickly gone from expanding into a new addition with much-needed classrooms to filling those classrooms with young and vibrant students that want to hear about God and Jesus.

2017:A We have had 20 new Year of households join this year. Along with these new Growth members, visitor attendance has seen significant increase. Some of the visitor attendance can be attributed to the different church programs, such as the Christmas Eve services (combined, over 400 attended the people three services) and the Children's Christmas program (where over children participated,

grandmas, grandpas, aunts and uncles packed the seats to see their performance).

Most of the visitors though, are people coming to "check us out" after receiving a "Welcome to the Neighborhood" pineapple or hearing about Peace in the

community or from friends and/or family. They continue of coming week after week because they have found out that "Peace is worth the drive." A good portion of these returning visitors are young

adults and families. Because of this growth, we added about 30 plastic chairs in the sanctuary this fall for additional seating. Matching sanctuary chairs have been ordered and should be set up in the next couple months.

Pastor's Report...Pastor David

I turn to the Psalms for expressions of thankfulness. Psalm 100 carries that feeling of celebration and thanksgiving for all that God has done in our lives and in the life of our church.

Psalm 100

¹Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth. ²Worship the LORD with gladness; come before him with joyful songs.

³Know that the LORD is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.

⁴Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name.

The Psalmist's concluding verse says it all.

⁵For the LORD is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.

As I reflect on 2017, I am ever mindful that the Lord is good! We've seen solid growth in worship attendance consistently over the whole year, even in the summer months. On average, 2017 worship has grown 19 percent. Some of that growth in worship attendance can be accounted for in visitors and guests, wonderful and thank you for coming. The rest of the growth is in faithful members choosing to worship more often and experiencing the Lord's goodness in worship.

More than once, I've heard someone say, "I want to come. I don't want to miss it." Another said, "If I'm gone

on a Sunday, I feel like I'm missing something." Parents comment that their children are paying attention and are engaged in worship. This fall, we added an additional 30 chairs in the sanctuary to provide more seating for this growth.



It's not about the numbers. It's about worship as the place where we experience God's enduring love for us in Jesus Christ. It is Christ's presence with us in Word and Sacrament that renews our spirits and brings us hope. Thank you for your willingness to come and share that love with others.

Psalm 100, verse five ends with "God's faithfulness continues through all generations." It will be important for us in 2018 to stay focused on God who in Jesus Christ is faithful, not just in a moment or a year but to believe that God's faithfulness is ongoing. It continues always. The psalmist illustrates this by saying it "continues through all generations."

2017 has welcomed an abundance of babies, children and youth to Peace. In one glance across our sanctuary

on Sunday morning, you can see the generations. From our charter members to our newly baptized, the generations gather in worship to share in God's ongoing faithfulness.

Seeing God's good work happening is a blessing and brings me great joy. Stephanie and I repeatedly recount how blessed we are to be with you at Peace. We are grateful to share in what the Holy Spirit is doing in and amongst us. Thank you for letting us share this with you! Peace

Christian Education Ministry Team Report

Our Christian Ed program has truly experienced an exciting time over the last year with some major growth going within the classes. We currently have five breakout classrooms and 22 children registered for Sunday School from preschool-5th grade. Our middle and high school kids also meet and range in size for attendance but sees an average of 15-20 on any Sunday in the conference room (which is up from our 10-12 kids in 2016). Our Sunday School curriculum for prek-5th has continued with SOLA which is a very userfriendly program that the teachers have an easy time with in terms of teaching and prep. Current teachers are Shawn Perez with the PreK, Stephanie Hanson with the 1st-2nd graders, Nicole Johnsrud with 3rd-5th grade. The older kids are meeting and discussing current topics with Meghan Weaver and Rachel Lotito with the Middle School and Joseph Perez and Ben Simon with the High School.

This year our Sunday School kids get to partake in music at the end of class where we also wrap up class time with a prayer.

The noisy offering buckets came back to Sunday mornings during service giving children the opportunity to drop their coins into the buckets prior to JAM. The second Sunday of each month is our "Noisy" offering Sunday where the kids will go around the church with their paint cans to collect loose change from the congregation. We set a Noisy Offering goal of \$500 for the LCMC churches in hurricane ravaged areas for September through December. We flew past the goal and were able to donate \$792.93. The students are then split into small groups according to age and go through 20-25 minute stations: craft, game, and/or music. They then enjoy a light meal before going home. The financial review by an outside accounting firm at the end of last year showed everything was in order. During the year, everything has followed generally accepted accounting principles.

I would like to thank Sue Buelke, financial secretary, and Judy Jacobson, financial administrator for all their work. Both of these people donate many hours during the course of the

For the year 2018 we are proposing a deficit budget of approximately \$25,000. At the time we built the sanctuary, we sold notes to some of our members to the tune of \$163,000. Prior to this year, we had only retired \$8,000 and in 2017 we retired \$25,000. As of the end of 2017 we still have \$130,000 outstanding. We have included an additional buy back of another \$25,000 in 2018, and we are asking the congregation for their help in retiring the balance of the notes during the next five years.





As a team, we determined the recipients of PLC's 2017 benevolence dollars (all organizations and donation amounts were approved by the Ministry Board) and utilized our discretionary funds to support those locally in need via the Good Samaritan Fund, the homeless blessing bags and Love INC.

In addition to monetary gifting decisions, the Missions team organized

several opportunities for PLC members to volunteer and serve those in need. Some of the organizations supported were local, while others were national and/or international (see table below for Mission specifics). The more notable activities for the year are as follows:

- On February 11, we held our first Missions Work Day at PLC. On this day, sewing machines, sergers and ten machinists descended upon the church to tie one quilt and to create 59 T-shirt diapers and eight pillow case dresses. For several of the machinists, it was a day of firsts.
- On September 24, we hosted PLC's third Mission Sunday. Terri Harris, Director of Love INC in Delano, was our guest presenter. Her message

reminded us to "....look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus (Philipians 2:4-5). The Mission team, along with the PLC youth, served up Peace Café. The Café proceeds were donated to the PLC youth.

Here at Peace, the Missions Team is comprised of people who are passionate about helping others. Our meetings are open to all. We would love to have you join us. We meet at church on the second Thursday of each month, beginning at 6:30 P.M., excluding June and July. If monthly meetings are not for you, we ask that you continue to support us, via prayer, donations and/or event participation.

2017 Committee Reports

Columbarium Committee Report

A Columbarium Committee was organized to develop a proposal for a Columbarium on church property. At the 2016 annual meeting a survey was distributed to determine interest level for a Columbarium. Based on the feedback from the survey, it appeared interest was high for the niches and plaques and that \$1500 - \$2,000 was a reasonable price for a niche and \$500 for a memorial plaque.

With that in mind, a committee was formed and plans were given to the City. We also asked the City to modify City Ordinance to accommodate our proposed Columbarium, and they agreed. Our goal was to begin construction by the fall of 2016.

However, since we would be "bumping heads" with the Church expansion project, the Ministry Board asked that the project be put on hold and for us to consider forming an Exterior Planning Committee to consider the best use of the rest of the

Church property. Although somewhat reluctant, our committee was expanded to assist in Phase Two. Phase two was designed to complement the Columbarium proposal. It included landscaping areas for multi-purpose use.

Jerry Hendricks, co-chair, was going to present the Phase One proposal in February, 2017. Unfortunately, Jerry suffered a stroke on January 27th so Jon Peterson agreed to proceed.

After getting feedback that the project was too expensive, it was decided to postpone the presentation until the fall of 2017. It was felt that we needed to reduce the cost and broaden our appeal to attract younger members.

With that in mind, the cost was reduced from \$156,000 to \$127,000 and these workshops were organized: 1) Wills and Trusts, 2) Health Care Directives, 3) Funeral & Memorial Services, and 4) Columbarium; A discussion. These workshops were well received and attended.

Unfortunately, the fourth and final workshop did not go as well as Although most of the expected. members agreed that we need a Columbarium and that our proposal was certainly attractive, there were questions on cost and financing. We had proposed selling Debenture Bonds to raise \$65,000 and taking out a line of credit for the remaining \$65,000. This would have allowed construction to begin once City and County approvals were received. Selling niches, wall plaques, brick pavers and granite benches would be used to easily repay this debt.

Since the Congregation has been inundated with Columbarium information during the past 20 months, the committee has been asked to "shelf" the project for six months to a year. This suggestion was well received by the Columbarium Committee.

When I volunteered to be on the Stewardship Committee I did not realize how good a group this would be to work with. We were all committed and worked very well together. Our committee consisted of Sue Beulke, Larry Cramb, Emily

Peterson, Pastor Dave Hanson, me-Jon Peterson and Andy Johnsrud as our ministry board representative.

We started meeting in late spring to discuss possible

themes and ideas. We came up with the 2017 stewardship campaign theme "Together We Make a Difference". We asked a number of members to participate in videos and tell us how they feel about Peace Lutheran Church. Each week's video addressed a specific question and was shown in church, emailed to members, and posted on YouTube and the church website. In addition to the first week's video, we asked people to personally answer the question, "Who has made a difference in your life?", write it on a handprint, and attach it to the church wall display. It was amazing how many responded by naming a parent, other family member, or mentor who taught them through words and example about

following Jesus. The following week, Time & Talent surveys were distributed and also made available on the church website.

The other questions invited introspection as to how we as individuals

make a difference for Christ through the gift of our time and talents and how our church makes a difference for our members, in the community and beyond. The last question, "Why do you choose to give?" was designed to get us to think about the importance of supporting the church and its ministries and how none of that happens without our financial gifts.

The stewardship packets were then distributed to all members with 2018 Faith Promises and Time & Talents. 50 faith promises were received (of 105 households) and 59 Time & Talents surveys (of 156 adult members). We would certainly gladly welcome any additional faith promise cards and/or Time & Talents from those who did not turn them in yet.

We would like to thank those who came alongside and assisted us with this year's stewardship campaign: the Lotito family in creating a church wall display for the campaign, Sarah Strand who set up, helped us tape, and edited our 4-part video series "Together We Make a Difference", Sandy Fleischman who helped rewrite the Time & Talent survey to fit to one page and all of the members who graciously agreed to appear in our video-taped series. Together We truly do Make a Difference.
