This is for all the mothers who lock themselves in the bathroom when babies keep crying and won't stop.

This is for all mothers who show up to work with spit-up in their hair and milk stains on their blouses and diapers in their purse.

This is for mothers who teach their sons to cook and their daughters to sink a jump shot.

This is for all mothers whose heads turn automatically when a little voice calls "Mom?" in a crowd, even though they know theirs are at home or are grown.

"Yea God" for Nicole Johnsrud

Even if you don't know Nicole personally, chances are you have seen her around. She is always very busy working with our children and youth. Nicole is the chair of Christian Education. She teaches Sunday School after worship. On the second Sunday of the month, she leads the Children's Choir and helps organize Noisy Offering. She is one of a two-person team that works with the SPARK Kids on Wednesdays. And if that isn't enough, she also helps plan and implement special events such as the Christmas Program, VBS, and more. Her warm smile and gracious personality endear not only the children and youth, but all who meet her.



I recently asked her about her involvement with the children's programs and the importance of them. Here is what she said.

Why do you think it is so important to have a strong youth and children's program at Peace?

Nicole: Our children are faced with and will be facing things as they get older (no matter what age) that we as adults, never had to face or even considered contemplating at their ages. Setting these kids up on a firm foundation of God and His love for them is critically important for their faith and ultimately their eternity. If we don't set these kids up early with a strong unwavering belief and foundation to build on, then we are not doing our job. It saddens me to think of what sort of things they will face and the strength they will need to withstand the storms, the pressures and evils of this world.

Why do you choose to personally work with Sunday School and SPARK?

Nicole: My personal reason is probably obvious but it is that my kids are this age, so it's an easy fit. But along with that, it all goes back to why, as a church, we have an obligation to these kids to bring them up in this faith walk. I truly feel like I've been placed here for that reason and I want to do the best job possible. I need to be able to say to God at some point, I hope I did what you needed me to do and I hope I did it well. I need to look back and be able to look in the mirror and say, I did my best and I hope the kids learn and feel the same. I need them and want them to know God is real, He loves you and so do I and everyone in this Church. I suppose at the end of the day, all I can do is plant the seed and then water it and love it and pray for it to take root.

What is the most important thing you hope the kids are learning?

Nicole: My hope is that the kids learn that God is good and even in trials and hard times; God is Good and He loves them unconditionally. As they get older I hope they know that they will make mistakes (as we all do) but that's not where it ends. We all will fall and stumble, but God is there to help us up and to walk with us every step. My other hope is they learn the power of prayer and that being with God is not just on Sunday mornings. I hope they understand the importance of being with God every day and always and that there is a peace that comes with that.
