Methods for Giving at Peace

As our Stewardship campaign comes to an end, let's talk about the different ways your gifts are received at Peace.

Methods for Giving at Peace

- Automated Giving through your bank — generally has no fees, and ensures your gift is received every week/month. When you set up automated giving, your giving is no longer dependent on remembering to bring your gift or whether or not you are actually in church that weekend. It just becomes automatic
- On-line Giving — this will soon be available through the church website *but please keep in mind that a small percentage and transaction fee is deducted from each online donation.*
- Offering Envelopes, weekly or monthly — are a good witness for children to see that we give back to God what he has first given us. If you are giving cash be sure that your name is written on the envelope (not necessary if your gift is in the form of a check).
- Donation of Stock — a popular way to make a charitable donation with tax advantages. Contact the financial secretary to coordinate this type of transaction.
- IRA Distribution — at age 70-1/2 IRA owners are required to take mandatory minimum distributions making this another popular way to give a gift.
- Planned Gift — designate Peace Lutheran as a beneficiary in a will or trust.

Mission Ministry Team **SVABW**

Southern Valley Alliance for Battered Women (SVABW) is one of the missions that we at Peace support. October was Domestic Violence Awareness Month. During October, SVABW focused their attention even more on the “epidemic that is called domestic violence by helping to raise awareness in our communities and by helping those that may not understand the severity of the topic.”

SVABW was founded by Maxine Kruschke in 1982 after leaving a 32-year marriage marred by domestic violence. Ms. Kruschke and a group of volunteers offered direct support to 5 victims of domestic violence out of her kitchen. Since that time SVABW has provided services, advocacy and support to over 18,000 women and their children on their journey for a violence free, healthy family life.

SVABW has many programs available for adults and children. If you know anyone that may need help, you can get more information by calling 952-873-4214. This number is answered 24 hours a day. You can also visit their website at svabw.org.

SVABW is also holding their annual poinsettia fundraiser and offers other ways to help. Visit their website or see a member of the Mission Ministry Team for more details.

According to their website “The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God’s love in a tangible way to children in need around the world, and together with the local church worldwide, to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child has collected and delivered more than 146 million gift-filled shoeboxes to children in more than 150 countries and territories. For many of these children, the gift-filled shoebox is the first gift they have ever received.”

Each year, Peace children pack boxes to be sent - with other boxes collected throughout the US - to children around the world. Will you consider being a part of this mission? Collection is through Wednesday, November 15th. SPARK Kids Klub will then be assembling the boxes. You can help by donating items to go in the boxes (lists are available on the Operation Christmas Child table). 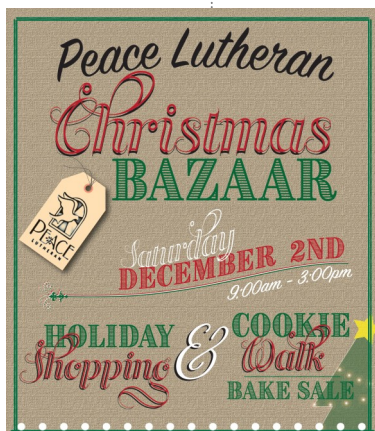

Hospitality Committee Cookie Walk & Bake Sale

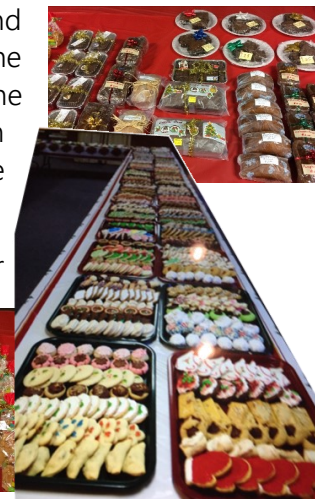
The Women of Peace are also working hard on the second annual Cookie Walk and Bake Sale which is held the same day and time as the Bazaar and is also open to the public.

This is quickly becoming a popular event with people already asking for details on this year's cookie walk. This is a great opportunity to have a variety of cookies or, for those who don't bake, to have home baked Christmas treats for parties and family gatherings.

For those who have never attended a cookie walk, here's what you can expect. When you arrive, you will be given a lined cardboard container. You will then walk through the line of cookies and baked goods choosing your favorites. After you have selected your items, you will pay for your cookies and bake sale items. The cookies are \$6 a dozen and the bake sale items will be priced as marked. The bake sale will continue Sunday morning. Unsold items are then delivered with Christmas blessings to shut-ins.

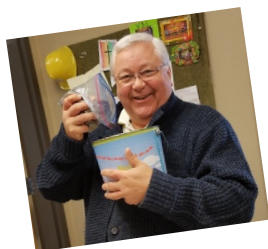


Noisy Offering Challenge

Statistics aren't for everyone, but when they bring good news they are worth sharing. Our worship attendance at Peace has been on the steady up swing statistically and musically. It is a joy to see God's good work happening here at Peace.

Our worship attendance over the past summer (June – August) was up 23%. Since Rally Sunday, September 10, our worship attendance has showed the same percentage increased - 23% over 2016. We had one Sunday, October 15 with 179 people worshipping. We have 200+ chairs in our sanctuary. We've added a few more but you can begin to see the growing need.

With such good news we will need everyone's help. Here are some thoughtful ways to multiply these blessings and make room for visitors and guests.
