Maybe that's why old churches are designed like upside down boats. Come, get in the boat and worship!

In the coming weeks you will receive many emails and updates from the church. I encourage you to look at them, add them into your schedule, and mark your calendars. We have a great fall being planned with many opportunities to share in fellowship, grow in God's Word and serve those in need.

I know it should go with out saying but please remember to pray. Pray each day. Pray for our friends on our prayer list. Pray for our church and its ministry. Pray for our nation and its leaders. Lastly, pray for summer to hang on a few weeks more!

VBS Mission

This year VBS supported a local mission — The Watertown-Mayer (WM) High School Special Olympics Unified Sports Club. This club serves students from the surrounding communities who attend WM High School.

The Unified Club unites Special Olympics athletes (individuals with intellectual disabilities) and partners (individuals without intellectual disabilities) as teammates for training and competition. By bringing students together, we are encouraging understanding and compassion for the differences in others, which creates a changing culture in the school and the community.

Seth Juncewski, along with the coach and several of the students from the Unified Club, came to talk to the students about the importance of the program and why they are involved.

The VBS mission team started the week with a goal of \$200, but the kids flew past it on Tuesday. On Wednesday the team upped the goal to \$400, but once again, the kids surprised everyone by exceeding the goal.

The team decided not to set anymore goals, but instead stood back and cheered the kids on. Everyone was so amazed and humbled at the generosity, energy, and excitement that the VBS kids and their families had for this mission. Some kids even donated money they had been saving for something special.

And lest you think that only the kids helped, the adults stepped up as well. There was a special offering on Sunday after VBS, and there were two donations from family members of VBS kids who saw the Facebook post and wanted to participate (see the notes below). In all, they raised \$1,400.16. There was so much momentum and excitement surrounding the mission that the local newspaper heard about it and wrote a cover article about PLC's VBS and the mission.

This mission donation was such a blessing to the Unified Club. They are a part of the Watertown Mayer School district but do not receive any funding for the program. This will help to purchase needed sports equipment and uniforms, pay for travel expenses and tournament fees, and so much more. Thank you to everyone who helped! 


